Mutsumi is chief news anchor of CTV Montreal News. Her interest in broadcasting began at Concordia University where she worked at Radio Sir George (CRSG) and the student newspaper, The Georgian and hosted a series of interview programs for Concordia University TV (CUTV) in conjunction with CTV Montreal (then known as CFCF 12). She has shared the 6 p.m. weeknight news anchor desk with Bill Haugland, Brian Britt, and Todd van der Heyden. Mutsumi now hosts the

noontime newscast and shares the 6 p.m. anchor desk with Paul Karwatsky.

Born in Shiroishi, Japan, she studied piano at the Toronto Conservatory of Music. She holds BA. and MBA degrees. In 2013, she was awarded an honorary doctorate by Concordia. She believes strongly in the importance of education, a legacy of her parents who were both academics.
